FELINE ANNUAL ORAL HEALTH HYGIENE AND PROPHYLAXIS

SERVICE	BENEFIT
Pre-visit Oral Anxiety Reducing Medications	These reduce any nervousness or fear your pet may have. They also decrease pain, allowing the use of lower amounts of anesthetic medications!
Pre-anesthetic Bloodwork - Serum Chemistry, Cell Volume	This testing allows your pet's anesthesia plan to be customized to their hydration level and internal organ function. We make anesthetic safety a priority!
General Anesthesia With Multi-parameter Safety Monitoring	Your pet's personal certified veterinary technician will use modern equipment to monitor them closely throughout the procedure. Anesthesia is required for thorough and effective dental cleaning and radiographs - so our safety standards are high to protect your pet!
Nursing Care by Fear Free & RECOVER CPR Certified Veterinary Technicians	Certified veterinary technicians are licensed, educated, and knowledgeable. Fear Free certification means your pet's emotional well-being is a priority and RECOVER certification provides emergency preparedness.
Bair Hugger Anesthetic Warming System & Private Heated Recovery Suite	Maintaining a warm core body temperature greatly reduces anesthetic risk, decreases recovery time and keeps your pet comfortable!
Dental Cleaning - Ultrasonic Removal of Supragingival & Subgingival Plaque & Calculus	Hand scaling or brushing only remove surface plaque from the tooth surface. Ultrasonic cleaning above and below the gumline actually removes the plaque biofilm that causes oral disease.
Full Mouth Health, Pain Assessment & Oral Cancer Screening	The veterinarian examines all surfaces inside your pet's mouth and tests reflexes that show pain that your pet often hides at home.
Full Mouth Radiographs - Imaging Above & Below The Gumline	Up to 75% of tooth structure is under the gumline. Full mouth x-rays are necessary to determine the health of tooth roots and surrounding bone where you can't see them.
Periodontal and/or Oral Surgery Recommendations & Consultation	Based on your pet's x-rays, you will receive a report of what (if any) periodontal or oral surgery is needed to address painful conditions and maintain good health. Most procedures can be done at Healing Paws as a follow-up surgical visit.
Crown Polishing	Reduces microabrasions in the tooth's enamel
Non-invasive Laser Therapy	Reduces inflammation and pain that occurs with gingivitis and stimulation of gum surfaces. This ensures that your pet is comfortable after the cleaning procedure.
